

What Type of Project Should we Select for this Transnational Initiative?

- Target community should have a vulnerable population living in an urban neighborhood with poor housing and neighborhood conditions.
- Significant health issue that contributes to knowledge on the impact of housing and neighborhood conditions on health.
- Rooted in a theoretical and conceptual framework.
- Generate hypotheses and a research strategy [study design & Methods].
- Health issue that is common to all project sites.

NIH research essential to global AIDS relief efforts

NIE-supported advances in edence are helping beep alto millions of people with HW/AIDS and are dramatically lowering transmission rates in developing countries, said U.S. Global AIDS Coordinator, Ambaseador Eric Goosby, in a recent ad dress to NEI leadership and staff

Goosby, who leads the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Selled (PEPPAR), cited the importance of three critical interventions based on NIH research: treatment of HIV infection with antiretroviral drugs, male circumciston to decrease the likelihood of disease transmission and interventions that prevent the virus passing from mother

These discoveries make it possible for the Administration to consider for the first time the possibility that an AIDS-free generation may be within reach, he said, 'n goal that would have been unthinkable, even several years ago."

NIS is a critical partner in the builde against AIDS, he said. with many of the early break throughs in understanding MIV and how to treat it flowing from NIM's scientific mand ate. "These advances have been fundamental to the steps PEDTAR has made in rapidly expanding the MIV



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response in low-income countries with high burdens of MV disease," he declared. "This link, between knowledge generation and rapid deployment in the spicenter of the pandemic, makes for a powerful combination."

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NIH Director Collins tours India research sites



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FOCUS

NISS Director Dr. Francis S. Collins made his first official visit to India recently, touring the country's top research sites, reviewing existing collab crations and discussing potential new areas for partnership. India is scaling up its investment in research and training, providing additional opportunities for collaboration. Collins met with leading scientists and students at NIES-funded institutions, gave several public lectures and participated in a summit on Icus-cost medical technologies. A joint U.S.-India effort to being explored to spur development of a flord able diagnostics and interventions intended to drive down health care costs in both countries. Collins also signed a greements to collab crate on stem cell research and diabetes.
