Situation Report No.23 Date: 28 October 2016 (11:30 EST) PAHO HQ- Washington DC



This report is produced by PAHO/WHO in collaboration with PAHO Country Offices, Ministries of Health, and with inputs from official organizations. This report covers the period from 26-28 October 2016 at 11:30 EST.

HIGHLIGHTS

- The Ministry of Health, accompanied by UNICEF and PAHO/WHO representatives, received a total of 1,000,000 doses of oral cholera vaccine that are being stored at PROMESS pending their transfer to Les Cayes and Jérémie for the upcoming cholera vaccination campaign.
- A peak of malaria cases can be expected by the end of November; rapid detection, treatment following national protocols and mosquito nets distribution should be among partner's priorities.
- PAHO/WHO presented the Post Disaster Needs
 Assessment (PDNA), which will be implemented with
 the leadership of Ministry of Planning and External

- Cooperation (MPCE) and the support of UNDP, the World Bank and European Commission.
- PAHO/WHO held health group coordination meeting today with MSPP; 27 organizations participated. Next meeting will be held on Thursday 3 November 10:00 am at PAHO/WHO.
- The cholera vaccination campaign will target 820,000 people in the 16 communes that gave reported suspected cholera cases or deaths related to cholera outbreak.

GRAND' ANSE DEPARTMENT

- DSGA's situation room will be fully functional tomorrow.
- A French Emergency Medical Team is treating patients in Saint Antoine Hospital.
- Suspected cholera case in Abricots.

- Challenges in restoring health facilities due to limited support.
- A dozen patients have already been evacuated in the last week through the helicopter medical evacuation system organized through MINUSTAH, UN agencies and MSF.

SUD DEPARTMENT

- DSS held health group coordination meeting with the participation of 17 partners.
- Mission Impossible/One Ball-One Village is distributing water filters.
- Urgent repairs to restore full functionality in Immaculate Conception Hospital were identified Partners are waiting on costing evaluation so a plan of action can be determined.
- Lack of medical supplies is delaying French EMT medical care in Les Cayes. PAHO/WHO is making arrangements to deliver those supplies.
- Reinforcement of health, WaSH, and safety interventions in shelters was requested.

RESPONSE:

MSPP

 Reinforced the importance of promoting breastfeeding and discontinuing powdered milk distribution, as water safety is an issue in many communities. Customs clearance for this product will not be granted.

PAHO/WHO

- Delivered medical supplies to Cavaillon and Quatre Chemins (Sud).
- Monitoring and evaluation actions continue during cholera vaccination campaign with dPEV, DELR, CDC, Partners in Health, Gheskio Centers and IMC collaboration.
- Two water quality control experts were deployed to Grand' Anse and Sud Departments to monitor WaSH and care and treatment in cholera treatment facilities.
- EMIRA teams are supporting mobile clinics in Chambellan and Abricot (Grand'Anse).

• Donation of cholera/WASH supplies to DPSPE/MSPP for hygiene promotion activities.

NEEDS:

- Renovate existing health structures into durable structures
- Increase humanitarian assistance to rural areas.
- Follow cholera case management protocols in CTCs and communities.
- Mobile clinics are needed in Ile a Vache.
- Increase distribution of water purification tablets and chlorine; and chlorination of water sources in coastal areas of Sud and Grand' Anse departments.
- Restore the cold chain to restart routine vaccinations.
- Restore epidemiological surveillance, especially in shelters.




MAP OF HEALTH FACILITIES DAMAGE ASSESSMENTS







MAP OF CTDA'S DAMAGE ASSESSMENTS






MAP OF SUSPECTED CHOLERA CASES
