
PUERTO RICO

Since Puerto Rico's training program for diabetes educators began in 1991, approximately 370 people have been trained. Several educators have set up diabetes education centers. In addition, there are the following: The Puerto Rican Diabetes Association and the Mutual Aid Hospital (Dr. Lydia Rodriguez) for people with type 2 diabetes and their family members. The Pediatric Center for Diabetes Education and Treatment, which has offered an education program for people with type 1 diabetes up to 18 years of age since 1998.
