- There is currently no national plan to address the use of solid fuels to cook. The Ministry of Social Security, Ministry of Mining and Energy, The Ministry of Land, Water, Environment and Climate Change, The Forestry Department, The National Environment and Planning Agency and The Health Ministry should be included in developing a strategy.
- Liquid petroleum gas (LPG) has replaced fuel wood as the primary household fuel in 84% of Jamaican homes.
- Electricity prices now reflect true cost. However, Government's policy continues to provide a lifeline rate, which benefits monthly consumers of less than 100kWh per month. This **cross-subsidy** is provided by those consumers using more than 101kWh per month.
- There are currently two government programs in place:

PATH Programme - The Programme of Advancement Through Health and Education (PATH) is a conditional cash transfer programme funded by the Government of Jamaica and the World Bank and is aimed at delivering benefits by way of cash grants to the most needy and vulnerable in the society. Does not intentionally target any public health issue

NHF - The National Health Fund is established to provide financial support to the national healthcare system. No project submitted toward this endeavour
