PROPOSED PAHO PROGRAM AND BUDGET 2010-2011

- 1. This document presents the second biennial Program and Budget for the Strategic Plan 2008-2012. The strategic objectives and region-wide expected results (RERs) included in this document are the same as those included in the amended PAHO Strategic Plan 2008-2012 also being presented to the 49th Directing Council. Thus, the PAHO Program and Budget 2010-2011 represents a proposal for a two-year costing toward the achievement of the RERs for 2010-2011.
- 2. The Pan American Sanitary Bureau (PASB) has undergone a Region-wide review of the RER indicators to ensure that they remain relevant and represent the best possible means to measure the Organization's achievements. As a result, some indicators have changed and others deleted in an attempt to improve their measurement and avoid duplicity.
- 3. In pursuance of good governance, transparency and accountability, this document presents for the first time separate budget figures by segment, similar to the presentation of the WHO global budget at the World Health Assembly. The three segments presented are: (a) PAHO/WHO base programs, (b) outbreak and crisis response, and (c) government financed internal projects. This differentiation has become necessary in recognition of the different budget and management requirements associated with segments (b) and (c) above, particularly given the unpredictable nature and magnitude of these two segments in recent years.
- 4. The proposal for base programs calls for US\$ 644 million in PAHO/AMRO regular budget and other sources. The portion funded by the regular budget amounts to \$287.1 million, which includes \$186.4 million from PAHO, assessed contributions. This represents a proposed increase of 3.5% in assessed contributions, as recommended by the 144th Executive Committee.

- 5. Budget figures are presented by strategic objective and region-wide expected result for the whole Organization, as well as sections for the subregional and country levels. Comparative tables are also presented showing changes from the previous biennium. The proposed resource levels by strategic objective incorporate comments and guidance received from Member States, internal discussions with strategic objective facilitators, as well as analysis that considers the regional prioritization model that has been previously discussed with Member States.
- 6. An addendum to the Program and Budget 2010-2011 (Official Document 333, Addendum) has been prepared in response to the requests from the Subcommittee on Program, Budget, and Administration (SPBA) and Executive Committee. That document presents four different budget scenarios and a justification for the requested increase of 3.5% in the assessed contributions. It also addresses the programmatic impact of such scenarios, and provides detailed information on the efforts made for efficiency and productivity.
- 7. At the time of a financial international crisis and when Member States are facing a pandemic, it is extremely important to invest in health in order to (a) protect the achievements in health, (b) strengthen health systems and services, based on primary health care, to ensure a suitable response to pandemics and other emergent diseases; (c) advance in the health related Millenium Development Goals in the Region, with special emphasis in prioritized countries, areas and populations; and (d) further advance in the implementation of the Health Agenda for the Americas.

Action by the Directing Council

8. The Directing Council is invited to review the PAHO Program and Budget 2010-2011 (Official Document 333) and to consider the adoption of the proposed resolutions recommended by the 144th Session of the Executive Committee in Annexes A and B.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION

PROPOSED PAHO PROGRAM AND BUDGET 2010-2011

THE 49th DIRECTING COUNCIL,

Having examined the proposed Program and Budget of the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) 2010-2011 (*Official Document 333*);

Having considered the report of the Executive Committee (Document CD49/2);

Noting the significant mandatory cost increases in fixed-term posts for 2010-2011, despite the Pan American Sanitary Bureau's (PASB) continuing and cautious efforts to reduce the number of fixed-term posts;

Noting the efforts of the Director to propose a program and budget that takes into account both the economic concerns of Member States and the Organization's public health mandates; and

Bearing in mind Article 14.C of the Constitution of PAHO and Article III, paragraphs 3.5 and 3.6, of the PAHO Financial Regulations,

RESOLVES:

1. To approve the program of work for the PASB as outlined in the proposed PAHO Program and Budget 2010–2011 (*Official Document* 333).

2. To appropriate for the financial period 2010-2011 the amount of US\$ 339,852,335, which represents an increase to assessments of PAHO Member States, Participating States, and Associate Members of 3.5% with respect to the biennium 2008-2009, as follows:

- 4. In establishing the contributions of Member States, Participating States, and Associate Members, assessments shall be reduced further by the amount standing to their credit in the Tax Equalization Fund, except that credits of those states that levy taxes on the emoluments received from the PASB by their nationals and residents shall be reduced by the amounts of such tax reimbursements by PASB.
- 5. That, in accordance with the Financial Regulations of PAHO, amounts not exceeding the appropriations noted under paragraph 2 shall be available for the payment of obligations incurred during the period from 1 January 2010 to 31 December 2011, inclusive; notwithstanding the provision of this paragraph, obligations during the financial period 2010-2011 shall be limited to the effective working budget, i.e., Sections 1-16 of the table of appropriations in paragraph 2.

- 6. That the Director of the PASB shall be authorized to make transfers between the appropriation sections of the effective working budget up to an amount not exceeding 10% of the amount appropriated for the section from which the transfer is made; transfers between sections of the budget in excess of 10% of the section from which the credit is transferred may be made with the concurrence of the Executive Committee, with all transfers of budget credits to be reported to the Directing Council or the Pan American Sanitary Conference.
- 7. That up to 5% of the budget assigned to the country level will be set aside as the "Variable Country Allocation," as stipulated in the Regional Program Budget Policy. Expenditure in the country variable allocation will be authorized by the Director in accordance with the criteria approved by the 2nd Session of the Subcommittee on Program, Budget and Administration, as presented to the 142nd Session of the Executive Committee in Document CE142/8. Expenditures made from the country variable allocation will be reflected in the corresponding appropriation sections 1-16 at the time of reporting.
- 8. To estimate the amount of expenditure in the program and budget for 2010-2011 to be financed by other sources at US\$ 355,851,000, as reflected in *Official Document 333*.
