#### Health services should offer multiple options to prevent HIV, including:

- √ Female and male condoms
- / Lubricants
- ✓ HIV testing
- ✓ Testing and treatment
  for sexually transmitted infections
- ✓ Harm reduction programs and needle exchange
- ✓ Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP)

HIV testing should be available in medical services and also in places frequently visited by key population groups.

## Provide TREATMENT FOR ALL

Almost half of all people living with HIV in Latin America and the Caribbean are still without treatment. Offering antiretroviral therapy as soon as HIV is diagnosed can keep people alive and healthy and reduces transmission.









### NEVER STOP

taking your medication

Starting treatment as soon as you find out you have HIV and taking your medication correctly ensures good health and reduces the risk of transmission.

HIV Treatment can be as simple as taking a single pill per day.

Good health is everyone's right. Stigma and discrimination prevent people with HIV from accessing health services.
