

# Declaration of Port of Spain, Sept, 2007

 Heads of Government recognised the burden of CNCDs as outlined the Report of the Commission on Health and Development

The Heads adopt a 15 point Declaration;

#### **Progress after Two Years**

- Joint NCD Secretariat operational PAHO and CCS are main contributors;
- Contributions from Food & Nutrition institute, UWI, CAIC and independent consultants;

Secretariat most active in support of Caribbean Wellness day

There is still a need for more dedicated staff coordinate and monitor the implementation of the Declaration





### International Support

- Canadian Support for study of Summit process, Promotion of Caribbean Wellness Day;
- PAHO support for coordination and capacity building;

DB support to UWI to examine sustainable nechanisms for surveillance of CNCDs in six ountries;





### International Support

- Spanish (AECID) support for Regional NCD plan formulation and some aspects of Data collection;
- Bloomberg Grant supporting reduction of the effects of 2<sup>o</sup> smoking, has assisted the region in arriving at a tobacco labeling standard

#### Monitoring

 Formal reporting to Annual Meeting of Chief Medical Officers in April;

Annual Report to Caucus Ministers in September;

Twice yearly assessment of Progress and reporting to Heads of Government in March

and July





#### **COHSOD** request to Heads to address

- 1. Establishment of Nat. Commissions on NCDs
- 2. Legislative agenda related to the International Framework Convention on Tobacco Control
- 3. Compulsory Physical Education in schools
- 4. Fair trade policies in all international trade negotiations. Labelling of foods to indicate nutritional content



- 5. Promote policies and actions aimed at increasing physical activity in the entire population
- 6. Public Ed. programmes in support of wellness. Observe Caribbean Wellness Day

#### Tobacco and Alcohol

- Both Trinidad and Barbados have Draft legislation on Smoking Prevention in Public places;
- The CARICOM Council on Trade and Economic Development (COTED) in 2008 supported the establishment of Standards for Labeling both Tobacco and Alcohol as adopted by the Ministers of Health;

#### Tobacco and Alcohol


 Caucus of Ministers of Health have requested COTED to review that aspect of the Rules of Origin within the CARICOM treaty which limits the taxes on cigarettes to excise duties;

Caucus has resolved to address and limit the harmful use of alcohol in its September 2009 meeting





# Excise Tobacco Tax as a % of Price in CARICOM Countries with Available Data (2006)







### **Labelling of Foods**

- Harmonised regional standardisation process actively being pursued
- currently at the "Public Comment"
- Then drafts will be finalised and submitted to COTED for approval.



Member states are then required to adopt & implement nationally usually through legal adoption of the requirements and specifications through a National Standard

#### **Other Actions**

- Bicycling in closed streets on Sundays in Trinidad;
- Purpose built walking paths as in Barbados;
- School meals policies adopted by 13<sup>th</sup> Special Meeting of Council on Human and Social Development 2008 Feb;
  - OHSOD 18 adopted the new schools curriculum for Physical Education 2008 Nov;





#### Other Public Sector Activities

- Declaration of St. Ann's by the Ministers of Agriculture 2007;
- Seminar on trade policy and NCDs 2009;
- Establishment of a laboratory in Jamaica to evaluate trans-fat content of foods

Partnership with the Caribbean Association of Industry and Commerce to support healthy workplace policies



# HCC Resolutions adopted by the OECS Health Ministers, 11th Sept 2009, in SVG

- a. National NCD / Wellness Commissions
- b. Ratification and full implementation of the Framework Convention on Tobacco Control
- c. Salt reduction programmes
- d. Support of the planned HCC public educational campaign on chronic diseases.
- e. *Support for Caribbean Wellness Day*







#### Pharmaceutical Access

- Two countries with specific programs for access to NCD Meds: Jamaica and Trinidad
- Two others seeing to alter procurement preference in favour of generics
- Completed Regional study evaluating the pharmaceutical registration systems and requirements for generic product procurement; 2009 Caucus supported strengthening of

harmaceutical systems to facilitate procurement





#### Challenges


- Major political changes since 2007 not helpful to policy continuity
- Only Five Countries have the NCD Commissions proposed in POS #2. Two since 2007
- Regional Coordinating Mechanism challenged by Financial and Human Resource constraints;
  - Donors not ready to support the NCDs in view of other global health priorities in particular Communicable diseases





#### **Challenges - Tobacco Control**

- Suriname, only signed on to the WHO FCTC in December 2008
- Bahamas, Haiti, St.Kitts/Nevis, St.
   Vincent & Grenadines, all signatories still need to ratify
- TRT had presented a tobacco control bill that is being discussed in the Parliament
- In some countries, bill is stalled.







#### Challenges

- Proliferation of Fast Food outlets without guidelines on food preparation (job issues);
- Threat of food price inflation and the importation into the region of low cost processed foods;

As a producer of exotic rums and a major tourism destination, reluctance to control alcohol use;

Lack of maintained safe public spaces for ohysical exercise;





# Challenges – Policy Reform in Schools:

- Greater emphasis on Health Promotion in Schools not just for:
  - HIV/AIDS
  - Health and Family Life Education (HFLE)
- Need for increased emphasis on CNCD prevention and control in HFLE to address. (A need for holistic curriculum reform to promote physical activity among youth.)
  - Obesity
  - Physical Inactivity
  - Healthy Diet
  - Tobacco and Alcohol





#### **Opportunities**

- Policy Academy UWI/U. Alberta in discussion;
- Gates Grant to support the public advocacy, legislation and objective support for policy formulation;
  - Potential Full IDB project to support larger surveillance system;
    - Donors meeting on sub-regional health cooperation strategy planned for Feb 2010
