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

Knowing your laboratory capabilities


- Can the National Reference Lab distinguish between CRE and CP-CRE?

 - How will you know if you have an outbreak?


Epidemic curve of the outbreak.



Example of IPC Environmental Cleaning Compliance




Need to ensure that the correct disinfectant is being used for the pathogen of interest (C diff and C auris needs higher level disinfectant)

Know what disinfectants are used at the hospital and if they are appropriate for the pathogen







Screening Cultures – You may need these data for action

- Of roommates/nearby beds
- Of high risk patients on admission
- Point prevalence surveys

Other Hospitals

- Do you know the rate of CR0 are in other hospitals in the region?
- Is there a notification system between hospitals when transferring patients?
