

- Universal coverage of reproductive health is a woman's right.
- More than 50% of pregnancies are not planned.
- Women pay more for health services, even though they earn less.
- Women's out of pocket expenditure is 16% to 40% higher than men's.
- Women are primarily the care-givers of ill and disabled family members, with no payment or recognition.
- In Mexico, women's contribution to unpaid health care is triple that of men.








International aid is less: Are governments meeting the needs for family planning?


International aid by ICPD component, Latin America and the Caribbean, 1997-2007 (millions of \$US)


Adolescents, rural women, and women with no education have less access to family planning

Women aged 15 to 49 living in a union who reported unmet need for family planning (%), circa 2005




