

Referral sites in Haiti available for survivors of sexual violence



After the earthquake, the Pan American Health Organization/World Health Organization, Ministry of Health, United Nations agencies, and Non Governmental Organizations reviewed the health facility services available for survivors of sexual violence in Haiti, and identified nine referral sites which are the following:

Overview of the institution:	Originally a clinic for eye care and dentistry, the outpatient clinic expanded its services to include basic primary health care, including medical care for sexual violence survivors, after the earthquake.
Characteristics of the population served:	Adults and children, mainly from the settlements
Types of services:	Medical care including medical exam, medical certificate, treatment for STIs, PEP, EC
Hours:	7 days/week, 8 am – 4pm
Procedures for obtaining services:	No appointment needed

Other activities related to violence:	At the clinic, GAPSI addressed medical needs of all types of violence cases including intimate partner violence and child abuse. In the settlements, URAMEL has a 13-person community education team, mobile brigades, and two tents to provide medical care and referral.

As well, there are 2 field workers and 1 social worker assigned to the sexual violence program who help identify individuals who may require services and follow up with survivors in their communities to ensure continuity of care.

Overview of the institution:	Outpatient clinic providing services to women and children, including vaccination, HIV/STI testing, pre- and post-natal care, treatment of hypertension, and pediatric care
Characteristics of the population served:	Women, female adolescents, and girls mainly from the Martissant, Delmas, and Carrefour areas of Port-au-Prince. Some patients also come from outside the capital, including Jacmel and Léogâne.
Types of services:	Medical care
Hours:	Monday – Friday, 8am – 2pm (or 3pm depending on number of patients)
Procedures for obtaining services:	Drop-in; appointments for follow-up services
Costs of the services:	Free
Referral sites:	Referral to GHESKIO for HIV related care. (HIV testing is done on-site if supplies are available); referral to HUEH for serious injuries. Internal referral to SOFA's program for legal assistance.
Type of staff who provide services to victims of violence:	2 doctors, 2 nurses, 1 auxiliary nurse
Other activities related to violence:	Community education through radio spots and distribution of referral cards for medical services to sexual violence survivors. SOFA has a community-based reception center located in the Martissant neighborhood called "Douvanjou" (the Creole word for "Dawn") with one permanent staff and two rotating staff who provide referrals for women and children survivors of sexual violence and accompaniment medical, legal, and psychosocial services. Field agents provide basic psychological care and the center runs 3 different psychosocial support groups (separate groups for adult women, adolescents, and children), referrals for individual psychological care as needed.
